<p><u>Day of the inspection</u></p> <p><u>Travel to and from the site</u></p> <p><u>On-site</u></p>	<p>The Regional Representative and MDRA shall jointly assess the risks associated with conducting the inspection by considering the following: Risks associated with traveling to and from the inspection. Adequacy of measures in place on-site for preventing COVID-19 amongst MDRA's and the builder/importer. Ability of the MDRA to comply with prevention measures during the inspection, including physical distancing. Additional prevention measures that may be implemented during the inspection to mitigate the risk of COVID-19 exposure. Possible deferral of the inspection.</p> <p><u>Day of the inspection:</u></p> <p>Prior to going on-site, request a confirmation that the above health declaration is still valid, i.e. builder/importer is not exhibiting symptoms. Any changes should be re-assessed with the Regional Representative to determine the best course of action. Maintain a 2-meter physical distance from other persons at all times. Wash hands regularly with soap and warm water or use hand sanitizer.</p> <p><u>Transportation to the site:</u></p> <p>Wash hands before and after using your vehicle. When carrying out the inspection with another MDRA, take separate vehicles. No more than one person shall be in a vehicle at a time. No passengers are allowed. Disinfectant should be used to disinfect all surfaces such as: the steering wheel all levers and control buttons including; turn signal, shift lever, radio and climate controls the dash board and console areas inside and outside door handles seatbelt</p> <p><u>On-site:</u></p> <p>Maintain a 2 meter physical distance from other persons at all times; Wash hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer prior to performing inspections. Wash or sanitize your hands during the inspection after touching potentially contaminated surfaces; Where no hand washing stations are available, use disposable latex or nitrile gloves and hand sanitizer with minimum 60% alcohol content Avoid exchanging articles such as pens, business cards or other items. Wash hands before and after meeting with builder/importer and do not shake hands. When carrying out the inspection with another MDRA, take separate vehicles and maintain a 2-meter distance from one another at all times while on-site. Gloves are not mandatory are not recommended when hand washing is possible/available. Should gloves be worn during any portion of the inspection, proper procedures on usage, donning and doffing must be followed. MDRA's shall not pass or share equipment. Ensure only one person enters a restricted space at any given time if the 2 meter distance cannot be maintained.</p>

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	<p>During the inspection, if the MDRA is of the opinion that the risks associated with the inspection can no longer be adequately managed, the MDRA shall discontinue the inspection and advise his Regional Representative immediately.</p> <p>When it is apparent that the builder/importer is exhibiting symptoms of fever, cough or difficulty breathing, the inspection shall discontinue immediately. The MDRA shall notify his Regional Representative, practice hand hygiene and physical distancing and follow post-site inspection procedures as noted below.</p> <p><u>The wearing of face masks or face coverings:</u></p> <p>Non-medical masks or cloth face coverings are not considered personal protective equipment.</p> <p>The best thing you can do to prevent spreading COVID-19 is to wash your hands frequently with warm water and soap for at least 20 seconds. If none is available, use hand sanitizer with a minimum of 60% alcohol base.</p> <p>Wearing a mask alone will not prevent the spread of COVID-19. You must consistently and strictly adhere to good hygiene and public health measures, including frequent hand washing and physical (social) distancing</p> <p>Wearing a non-medical mask or face covering is intended to prevent spread of infection from the wearer, but has not been proven to protect the person wearing it from becoming infected.</p> <p>The wearing of a mask is only recommended in situations where physical distancing cannot be consistently maintained.</p> <p>In these circumstances and to ensure protection of all individuals taking part in the inspection, a mask should be worn by all involved in the activity.</p> <p>The use of surgical-type masks by individuals without symptoms of cough or sneezing is not recommended and may actually increase the risk of self-contamination and risk of infection. However, for the protection of others, you may choose to wear a non- medical mask. Disinfectant wipes or similar alternative such as disinfectant spray may also be used for surface cleaning. For hand hygiene, where soap and water are not readily available, hand sanitizer with minimum 60% alcohol, preferably with moisturizer, is recommended.</p> <p>Before putting on a mask: Clean hands with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water. Cover mouth and nose with mask and make sure there are no gaps between your face and the mask. Avoid touching the mask while using it; if you do, clean your hands with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water. Replace the mask with a new one as soon as it is damp and do not re-use single-use masks. To remove the mask: remove it from behind (do not touch the front of mask); discard immediately in a closed lined garbage container; clean hands with alcohol-based hand sanitizer or soap and water. Masks worn must be used in combination with frequent hand cleaning with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water.</p>

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<u>Post-Inspection:</u>	<u>Post-Inspection:</u> Once the inspection is complete, practice hand hygiene. Any equipment used can be cleaned with household cleaner, soap and water, or a diluted bleach solution. Used clothing should be washed in a regular hot water laundry cycle and may be laundered with other equipment. MDRA shall communicate any concerns related to COVID-19 that they encountered during the inspection, as applicable. MDRAs shall continue to self-monitor for signs and symptoms of COVID-19. MDRA shall report any illness to s Regional Representative. <u>The best ways to prevent the spread of infections is to:</u> Frequently wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not readily available; Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth, especially with unwashed or gloved hands; Avoid close contact with people who are sick; Cough and sneeze into your sleeve and not your hands; Stay home if you are sick to avoid spreading illness to others; Maintain a 2 metre distance from other people (whether they are sick or healthy); Avoid large and non-essential gatherings; All MDRA are asked to self-monitor for symptoms. If a MDRA develops fever, cough, difficulty breathing, he should take precautions not to spread the infection by staying home, contacting his Regional Representative and following his instructions. Ensure personal electronic devices are sanitized using a disinfectant wipe or equivalent \geq 60% alcohol wipe.
